



additional changes: p.77 onwards;

Key point: wherever the main fugue subject 'Wor-thy art Thou, Lord' appears (5 syllables) invert the order to become 'Lord, Thou art wor-thy', to give due emphasis to the word 'Lord' as in the German 'Herr'

p.77 b.1-2 A./ b. 5-6 S/ b.9-10 B/

p.78 b.1-2 T/ b.5-6 A/ b.7-8 S/ b.9-10 B / b. 10 A/

p.79 b.1 T/ b.2-4 S (2 notes on 'wor-')/

p. 80 b.4 S/b.8 B+A/p.81 b.5 B/

p.82, b.4 S, b.5 A, b.6 B, b.7 T, b.8 B.

p.84 final 2 bars, B then T,
